Consequently, I will be seeking more formal quotes for the repair and I am calling upon all Members (**Gold members**, please consider donating if you have not given yet this year) to donate toward repairing the parking lot. The goal is to raise \$10,000.00 from donations by September 1. All donations will be spent exclusively toward parking lot construction.
